Since 1989, thousands of children across the country have improved their skills and discovered the joy of reading with support from Oasis tutors.

Oasis Intergenerational Tutoring is a volunteer program that pairs older adults with children in grades K-3 to work one-on-one each week as their tutors, mentors and friends. Oasis tutors use a six-step approach to literacy designed by educators that emphasizes improved reading, speaking, listening and writing.

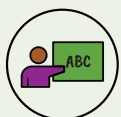

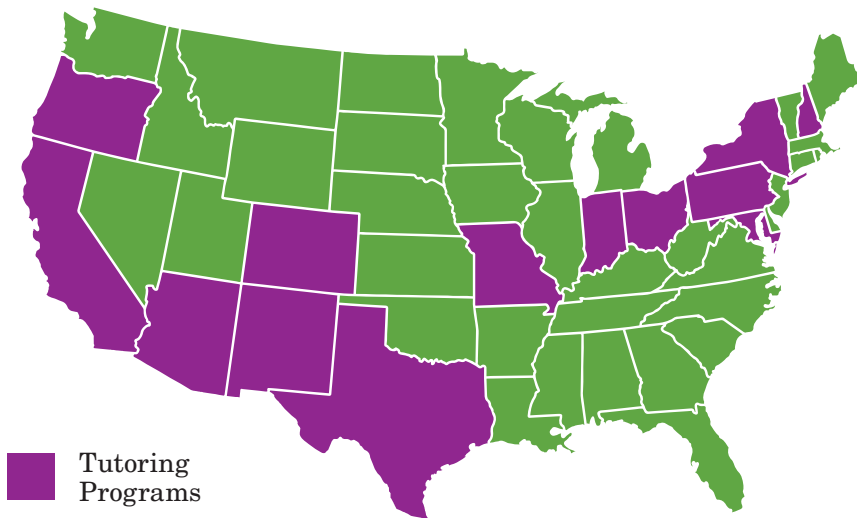
# National Impact

Oasis Intergenerational Tutoring is the largest older adult tutoring program in the U.S., and has reached more than **444,000 children** over the last 30 years.

In 2018, Oasis tutors helped **21,000 children** in **682 schools** in **75 school districts** across the country.



More than **4,500 Oasis tutors** volunteer in **13 different states** in over **20 U.S. cities**.

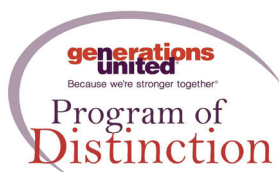
## There's more to Oasis!
